Color home movie footage of the concentration camp at Heart Mountain, Wyoming, filmed by Reverend Stanley T. Evans on his trip to visit Reverend Donald Toriumi (of First Presbyterian Church) circa 1943 to 1945. Footage shows general exterior views

There is also footage of men in uniform, soldiers drilling, boys playing basketball, children carrying books and walking in front of barracks and people leaving barracks.
