No mail from you yesterday and today; no word at all from Dorothy since receipt of the postal eard which I forwarded on to you. I feel quite alone up here. Did get the coat today from F&C and it looks even better than it did in the store.

Yesterday I didn't write you at all; we worked quite a crew here in the evening and at 10:00 o'olock I was pretty thred, so went on over to bed and was asleep before eleven. First long sleep --about 7% heure---that I have had for wuite a while. All I have no far in the little apartment is a test and class of drawers. give up our any blankets by the lith of fulg. Mond any Wenne davies from you on what I should may suppose that you badding is hard to find and expendive. Please let me know what is the best approach. These care twin beds, you know.

approach. These are twin been, you know. It is not likely I will be in San Francisco before the lith, maybe not then, if I an to stay out here. Today I framed a letter to Fryer, our Regional Director, fidts. San Francisco, to the effect 1 don't give a D-- whother the Civil Service Come. approve a raise In pay or transfer for me. Just wrote the letter to have it ready in ease....Rave thought of doing the same thing before this and never properly put the idea in effect. Fryer will be here comprov. also Dillon, our new Rational Director, also another Bind whom I never heard of before--and ke one around here seems to know.

First interuption, -Bill, chap I round with at the Barracks-Just came by to say good-by-got his call for the Army Air Corps and must be in Portland to be sworn in temorrow. That's the way they go. He has been about the nicest chap I have seen around this camp. He is a protestant and all of the Niesze Soil of Conservation (or something) are Catholics, but the one LDE boy. Do you wonder I feel like an outsider.
