Oct. 11, 1942

Hello Johnny:

Sorry I didn't write right away but ever since I came to Wyoming, I've been pretty busy. I started working in the hospital the day after I came here & since every thing was unsettled it kept me pretty busy. Most of the stocks & drugs supplies which are furnished by the St. Louis Army Medical Depot are not here so we're having one heck of a time trying to fill the prescriptions of the Doctors. We're getting some of the needed stocks on an emergency purchase from a drug store in Cody Wyo, so it helps a lot. Pretty soon we'll have all the need in the hospital.

We've had, in the past month, dust-storm, blizzard, rain & more dust storm. The weather at present is like So. Calif. but any day now we're going to have a very cold spell. I've been busy putting in an insulator for our units known as "eclotex". I've finally completed it last week so I'm not worrying about the cold any more. The carpenters took so long in installing these "eclotex" that it got me
