

The letter is dated October 6, 1942 and is about how hot the summer as been, the classes she is taking, and the upcoming contest that is similar to Nisei Week.; Transcription: Dear Molly, Certainly was glad to hear from you. I suppose you had a wonderful summer. That's for the postcard from Oakland. Sad, you're sure lucky to have had such luck to be up there. My summer was spent in an oven if you get what I mean. It sure was hot, and still is. Indian Summer you know. Worst summer I've ever had. Well, there really isn't too much to talk about but listen to this good news or in a way bad too. School started yesterday and here's my program Blk 2 Core 8:10-9:45 Blk. 18 Shorthand 2:10-3:

00 Blk. 45 Clothing 3:10-4:00 Our campus takes up the whole camp. As there are no building yet, we are being taught in the recreation halls, in case you don't know what core is, it's English and social studies put together. Notice how much tie I had between 10-2.
